We are also looking forward to welcoming back some of our Spring outdoor education groups that haven't been able to stay here since 2019. Along with school groups, we have an array of weekend retreats, training days, work days, job fairs and 4-H camp counselor meetings to keep us on our toes until our Summer (reinforcements) staff arrive for staff training in mid-late May.

Spring is most definitely in the air and we can't wait to share the magic of 4-H Camp Ohio to both old and new!

FACILITIES: SPRING PROJECTS

Our dedicated Facilities Volunteer Team hasn't let the winter months slow them down—instead, they moved some of their focus indoors and took full advantage of that unseasonably milder weather when we did get it! Goals for this Spring include:

- Finish painting the exteriors of the final 4 buildings.
- Finish with the clean-up of the area around the new high ropes course. This includes removal of stumps, installing stone paths, removing tree debris and seeding the area.
- Install four steel entrance doors on cabins 1, 2, 3 and 5
- Work to complete a wide variety of small maintenance and improvement projects around camp.
