

Impatiens pallida



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Sometimes referred to as the pale touch-me-not, because the ripened seed pod that develops after flowering explodes when touched

Persicaria maculosa



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A weed species that frequently exists near human activity, can be used to create a yellow dye when alum is used as a mordant.

Persicaria punctata



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Very variable plant that can be annual or perennial

Lobelia cardinalis



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Commonly known as cardinal flower due to its similarity to Roman Catholic Cardinal vesture.

Cephalanthus occidentalis



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Buttonwillow, California got its name from the buttonbush, due to a lone buttonbush being the landmark on a historic trans-San Joaquin Valley trail. This buttonbush was also used as a meeting spot by the ancient Yotuks. Now it is a California Historical Landmark (no. 492).
