SMITH LEVER ACT

How to Reduce Food Waste

Tips for saving money & the environment



If fresh produce is continuously going bad before you can use it, try to purchase smaller quantities or opt for the frozen or canned version.

Use the parts of the produce that you don't normally utilize such as leaving the skin on potatoes or using broccoli stalks for slaw.





Save vegetable scraps in the freezer to make your own homemade vegetable stock.

Compost food scraps that are unable to be used for cooking. Compost can be a great addition to any home garden and keeps food waste out of landfills.







HOME FOOD PRESERVATION

Miss Alice Swisher gave baking and canning demonstrations including stretching wheat flours by various mixes (1917 or 1918)



- 1913 Texas Bottle Co., Wichita Falls, Texas, acquired; new plant built and operated until 1951
- 1914 Began making rubber sealing rings for jars
- 1915 Ideal jars first produced; discontinued 1962

1920 Jelly glasses introduced

1922 Eclipse jars manufactured un

1925 Schram Glass Manufacturing acquired, with plants in Hillst Huntington, W.Va.; and Sapul

1929 Pine Glass Corp., Okmulgee, closed in 1994 **Today:** Home Food Preservation = Canning, Drying and *Freezing*. In person and online classes.
