On September 16th, UB students reunited after summer break to attend the 33rd annual Great Mohican Pow-Wow in Loudonville, Ohio. We entered through the front gate, nestled in a beautiful valley in the Mohican forest. We saw rows and rows of vendors with Native American crafts hand-made from minerals, wood, fur, and bones, along with food vendors selling fried bread and other

dishes. Nearby the Dance Ring, there were massive Teepees set up for display and sale. In the white tent set up near the gate,



Lance White Eagle told stories of different Native American creation myths while Douglas Blue Feather played the flute in the dance ring. It was a beautiful day of learning about the culture of the Native American people.
