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Caring for Others

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Cloverbud aged children often focus on themselves as they are forming their self-concept. As young Cloverbud children (5 – 6 years old) become 7- to 8-year-olds, they start to increase their awareness and concern for others; in particular, they can have empathy toward others. Empathy results from an increase in their emotional understanding skills as thinking abilities



develop and through social experiences. In the 4-H Cloverbud program we can help members learn to care for others and grow their empathy skills.

Certainly, it's a good thing to care for others and be kind, but why is empathy and caring for others important for Cloverbuds? By learning to care of others, children benefit in many ways:

- · Contributes to their overall healthy development
- · Builds positive relationships with other kids and adults
- · Feel a sense of accomplishment
- · Increase their self-esteem and confidence
- Creates a sense of belonging






