Dear 4-H Members:

Here is your **PRE-FAIR JUDGING NEWSLETTER!** As a participant in still project judging, having the opportunity to interview with a judge to talk about your experiences and learning moments in your project is a valuable skill that very few other extracurricular activities offer to all their members. By participating in this experience you will...

- Demonstrate and learn keeping of accurate, up-to-date records.
- · Gain interview skills, build self-esteem and poise.
- Receive feedback from a professional in the field on your project(s).
- Have the opportunity to balance knowledge gained regardless of the features of the finished product.

Most of the judging will take place at the Fulton County Extension Office, located at the Robert Fulton Agriculture Center, across from the Fulton County Fairgrounds, except for some STEM projects. Please take note of the schedule to see where your judging is being held. Still project judgings will continue to be held over the course of 4 days! All projects must be interview judged to be complete in their project before they are eligible to show or display at the Fulton County Junior Fair.

To be eligible for county and state awards you must attend judging on the scheduled day and time for your project. Be sure to check the county and state judging guidelines (see below, right) to see what specific items you must bring to judging. Throughout this newsletter you will find the judging schedule with the times listed for each project. Please plan on arriving within the scheduled window. You will be judged in the order you check in. If there is not a time range, come at the specific time because you are the only person taking that project.

If you cannot make it to your assigned judging or will not be attending, please contact the Extension Office at 419-337-9210. You may attend make-up judging. Make-up judging will be conducted during regular judging days by available judges. Projects judged at make-up judging are not eligible for county awards or the Ohio State Fair.

Nightly, during still project judging week, the winners will be notified via email of their status. Winners will also be posted to our website each morning announcing the previous days winners. No winners will be given out over the phone. If you have any questions, call the Extension Office. Good luck with your projects!

Make-Up Judging

Make up judging options: This can be done July 10-13 by available judges at the Extension Office. Still projects can also be judged by any non-related club advisor before the start of Fulton County Fair.

Projects judged at make-up judging are not eligible for county awards or State Fair competition. Please call the Extension Office 419-337-9210 if you cannot attend your regular scheduled judging day.







TIPS FOR 4-H JUDGING

- Be well groomed. That includes clean hands, hair and fingernails (fingernail polish is either all on or all off fingers and/or toes).
- Dress professionally, as if for a job interview. Boys: wear button downed, collared shirts and slacks. Girls: modest dresses or shirts/skirts. No spaghetti straps. No flip flops.
- Don't chew gum.
- · Use good posture. Make sure you sit or stand straight and tall.
- · Be polite and use your best manners.
- Shake the judge's hand and introduce yourself when you enter. Shake their hand again and thank them when you leave.
- Be prepared to talk about your project. Know what you did, how you did it, what you learned and what you might do differently the next time.
- When answering the judge's questions, speak clearly and loudly enough for the judge to hear your answers.
- During your interview, look directly at the judge. Give him/her your full attention. Don't be distracted by other people or noises around you.
- Be pleasant and confident. Smile and be enthusiastic!
- Be proud of your accomplishments!! You worked hard to earn them.

Judging Guidelines

- For completion, all 4-H projects must be judged.
- To receive a premium, projects <u>must</u> be exhibited at the Fulton County Fair in your club's booth or the miscellaneous booth in the Jr. Fair Building.
- All 4-H members are responsible for bringing their project to the appropriate judging.
- No premiums will be paid if project is taken home early from the fair. 4-H members are responsible for removing projects from the Jr. Fair Building between 5-9 p.m. on the last day of the fair or items will be disposed.
- All 4-H members will participate in two leadership/citizenship experiences as required by the "Planning Your Project" section in your project book.

Poster Guidelines

Many projects require a poster for judging. Listed below are some guidelines for making a poster. Remember, if the guidelines are not followed, the project grade may be lowered.

- Tell just one story on a poster.
- Keep it simple.
- Make lettering large enough to be read from a distance of 4-8 feet. Letters should be at least 1/2 inch high.
- Your poster, if required, should attract attention. Make it as colorful and attractive as possible so that fair-goers will stop and look at it.
- Keep it neat, but do your own work. Use printers, Cricut and/or Ellison machines, etc. before handwriting a poster.
- Poster should be appropriate to the size of exhibit it contains. (Unless the poster size is specified in the project guidelines.)
- Poster should include project name and 4-H'ers name. Be sure to check your project Guidelines for poster size! No larger than 22" x 28" posters.







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
