

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MASTER OF LEARNING TECHNOLOGIES DEGREE

The Master of Learning Technologies (MLT) will be a professional degree, focused on applying current research and foundational topics to solving problems of practice facing the use of technology to support learning in a number of contexts including:

- Traditional K12 classrooms
- Online K12 Schools
- Professional and corporate contexts
- Higher Education Institutions
- Not-for-profit organizations
- Regional and National Service Organizations
- Military
- Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)

The Graduate Studies Handbook is available online at <http://ehe.osu.edu/educational-studies/students/degree-information>. Section VI specifically deals with Master's degrees although other sections are also important for successful completion of your graduate degree.

I. Program of Study

You are expected to complete an approved MLT program of study. The program must include 7 learning technologies core courses, a research course, an elective and participation in a capstone practicum experience, must be approved by your advisor, and must be within the rules of the Graduate Studies Committee. (ref. Graduate School Handbook, Section II.5.1).

You will receive a Degree Program and Annual Review worksheet at orientation through the MLT Hub located on our learning management system, Carmen. This form will be used as your guide to the required curriculum. Additionally, you should run a Degree Audit regularly to track your progress through your degree. You should share the results of your degree audit with your advisor annually and turn in signed forms to the Student Services office at EdStudies@osu.edu.

II. Research Requirement:

All MLT students must complete a minimum of three (3) semester hours of graduate credit related to educational research design and data analysis (ESQREM 6625).

III. Program Coursework:

Students must complete all required coursework for their degree and specialization. A maximum of three substitutions to approved coursework can be made with the advisor's approval. Additional substitutions must be approved by the Graduate Studies Committee.

IV. Non-Thesis Option: (Minimum of 30 graduate credit hours)

All students will be required to participate in a practicum experience in which they document their experience in an electronic portfolio. This practicum will serve as the required comprehensive exam for this degree. Each student will be paired with a mentor in a professional setting who will guide and evaluate the practicum work. Two faculty members will evaluate the student's portfolio against program standards and will require at least 85% of the possible points in the published rubric (available from faculty).

V. Time Limit: For students admitted to the MLT program: Requirements for the Master of Learning Technologies should be completed within a five (5) year period. This includes transfer credit, which must be completed within the five (5) year period for the degree.
