NPA 678: Leading Social Change: Institutions and Policy (2)

Dates:

January 12-14, 2016 Immersion (5 sessions) plus Jan. 9 and 23, 2016 for two preparatory and two post immersion sessions at USF-SF.

Program:

An academic immersion course in Washington, D.C. to learn directly from nonprofit leaders and policy experts working at the federal level on nonprofit issues. The program includes site visits and panel discussions with nonprofit organizations such as Independent Sector, Alliance for Justice, the National Council of Nonprofits, and Jesuit Refugee Service. Students will visit the World Bank and the Offices of Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi and Senator Diane Feinstein. ** Panels will be held at USF conference room at University of California Washington Program (UC DC).

Fee:

Two MNA graduate unit registration cost plus \$450 program fee to cover two hotel nights, double occupancy, and a welcome dinner. Students are responsible for arranging their own airfare.



Program: Rome is at the epicenter of the current European crisis for refugees, forced migrants and human trafficking. The program explores these interconnected issues by learning directly from key nongovernmental and international organizations. Students meet with experts and visit centers engaged in these humanitarian and

refugee emergencies. They also receive a certificate of participation after a visit to the United Nations specialized agencies in Rome.






