Our 2019-20 Year in Review

Now that we have reached the end of the academic year, we wanted to give you an update regarding some of the exciting developments within the Swig Program in Jewish Studies and Social Justice. This year we:

 Welcomed Rabbi Camille Shira Angel as the first Rabbi-in-Residence in USF's illustrious 165-year history. Through her appointment, Rabbi Angel is forging new partnerships between JSSJ and University Ministry (and beyond!), strengthening the educational and programming efforts of both.

- Welcomed two new JSSJ faculty to campus: Dalit Gvirtsman, who leads our Hebrew language program, and Alexis Herr, who teaches courses on Holocaust and Genocide. Professor Herr has also just published her third book, Darfur Genocide: An Essential Reference Guide (ABC-CLIO Press).
- Offered 27 courses with more than 900 students enrolled in our classes.
- Offered 9 public events, all free and open to the public, with more than 1,200 people in attendance.
- Relaunched Beyond Bridges: Israel-Palestine, a two-week summer program in Israel and Palestine that takes students on a journey of comparative conflict analysis and tranformation. Originally offered during the summers of 2010-12, although the summer 2020 program was canceled due to COVID-19, it is now -once again! -- part of USF's ongoing study aborad options.
- Launched Arabic San Francisco, a new three-week intensive Arabic language program offered in conjuntion with our Hebrew San Francisco: Ulpan. Summer 2020, we will welcome students in our inaugural Arabic program in a new revamped online course to meet the needs presented by the global pandemic.
- Created our first Community Engaged Learning (CEL) course, "Honoring Our LGBTQIA Elders," taught by Rabbi Angel and offered for the first time in fall 2020. Through community-engaged experiences, students will have the chance to work with LGBTQIA elders and, in doing so, not only honor and help celebrate those who have fought for LGBTQIA rights but also harvest the wisdom from those who came before us.
- Launched "QMunity" and "Breaking Bread and the Binary," two new studentcentered programs offered by Rabbi Angel in partnership with JSSJ and University Ministry.
- Added eight new videos to our new JSSJ YouTube channel, bringing our total number of JSSJ event recordings (2012-20) to 44, all of which are ADA Compliant and include closed captioning alongside written transcripts.

We have steadily become one of the most important Jewish Studies programs in California and nationwide. Integrating social justice and human rights values rooted in Judaism, our extraordinary work is transforming countless people in a Jesuit Catholic setting. In this critical moment in history, we are a nexus of interfaith, progressive values and Jewish traditions.

We appreciate your help in building this one-of-a-kind program and look forward to another year of education, growth, and community. Stay tuned for announcements regarding our public programs and community events for the upcoming 2020-21 year. We hope you will join us, whether in person or online, as we continue our educational efforts to *change the world from here*.
