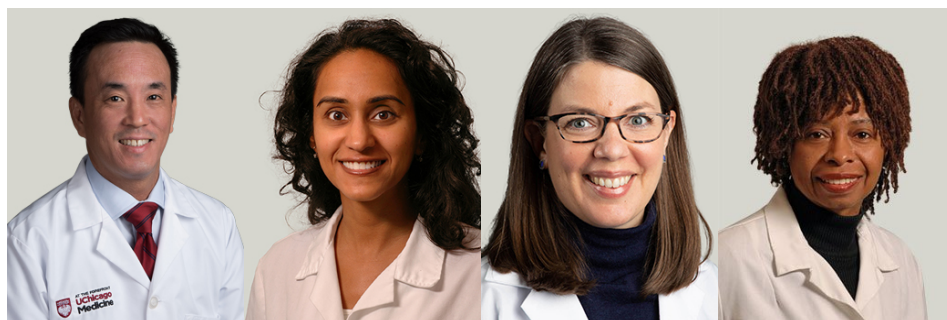

[UChicago and Rush receive \\$20 million NIH grant to build health disparities research network](#)



The University of Chicago and Rush University have received a \$20M, five-year grant from the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities to establish one of 11 new Centers for Multiple Chronic Diseases Associated with Health Disparities. UChicago and Rush will use the grant to launch the Chicago Chronic Condition Equity Network (C3EN), a project that will focus research efforts on addressing health disparities for African Americans and Latinos in the Chicago region. Elbert Huang (Medicine) is co-director of C3EN, which will manage R01-funded clinical trials led by Arshiya Baig and Megan Huisingsh-Scheetz (Medicine) and a community engagement core led by Doriane Miller (Medicine).
