Student Spotlight - Allison Collins



Allison Collins was one of the Quern Fellows for last summer. Her research project was Predictive Analytics for HIV Response in Malawi GPHAP Student. HIV remains a challenge in Malawi, where an estimated 1M people are living with the disease at ~10% of the population. As part of the effort to reduce new infections and get treatment to those who are HIV-positive, there is an ongoing project to foster the use of data in service delivery: the Kuunika Project. Through the Quern fellowship, I was afforded the opportunity to conduct an independent piece of research regarding using electronic medical records to predict patient default on taking antiretroviral drugs. The aim of this analysis was to enable the delivery of more tailored care, by analyzing success of various treatments against patients' characteristics to inform the Malawi Ministry of Health's development of a new HIV strategic plan.

Webinar March 11: How low- and middle-income countries can embrace value-based care on the path to universal health coverage

Dr Chintan Maru, Director at the Global Development Incubator and Executive Director of Leapfrog to Value, will present for a live webinar on 11 March at 12 pm CMT. Chintan Maru is a medical doctor and public health expert who has dedicated his career to maximizing the value of health systems. He is the lead author of the report Leapfrog to Value (https://www.leapfrogtovalue.org/).

Previously, Chin was a consultant in McKinsey & Co's health systems practice, where he led value-based care reforms for payers, providers, and state governments in the United States; and advised on public sector delivery transformations in sub-Saharan Africa.

March 12: USAID Sustainable improvement efforts

This webinar will share findings from the USAID Applying Science to Strengthen and Improve Systems (ASSIST) project. The USAID ASSIST project synthesized literature on sustainability and transition of improvement efforts. Key sustainability factors for improvement efforts were noted. These are highlighted in a framework aimed at designing improvement efforts and exit strategies to maximize long-term sustainability.

April 3: The Economics of the Opioid Epidemic Conference

The Economics of the Opioid Epidemic conference is hosted by Casey B. Mulligan, acting director of the Project on Foundational Research in Health Care Markets and Policies, and will explore the various efforts in public policy and their subsequent impact on the crises. Researchers will make presentations on aspects of the epidemic including the targeted drug launch and marketing tactics of the Pharma Industry, the introduction of abuse-deterrent opioid substitutes, the expansion of Naloxone access across state-run facilities, and the mandating of rigorous prescribing practices through Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs (PDMPs).
