Student Spotlight – Rosie Rogers



Meet Rosie Rogers, an SSA student and GPHAP Erickson Fellow! This past summer Rosie interned with UChicago Medicine's Urban Health Initiative (UHI), within their Community Benefit and Evaluation team. UHI is involved in a variety of services and programs to address health equity on Chicago's South Side, and a majority of her projects involved evaluating and selecting community partners/organizations who had either received or were hoping to receive grant money for programs targeting health disparities and violence prevention (especially within the UCM service area). While she worked on analyzing data and outcomes from recent grantee recipients to determine if they had met their targets/goals, her most significant summer project was contributing to the launch and execution of the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Grant which awarded organizations dedicated to addressing food insecurity, workforce development, and access to care. As a clinical social work student, she typically works directly with individuals who have been impacted by policies and the unequal distribution of health care resources and opportunities. This year her clinical rotation is at a Chicago hospital's social work department within their Women's Health and Neuro/Spine ICU departments where she works directly with patients and their families. Her summer at UHI gave her the opportunity to contribute to more administrative, meso/macro-level, public health initiatives to prevent or alleviate harmful environmental, physical, and social conditions that impact the health and well-being of marginalized populations. Her experience with UHI, has amplified her desire to maintain a role in both direct service and health care policy/administration moving forward.
