College Customs

There are certain customs that have been handed down by tradition in the college, which it is well for Freshmen

to observe in order to avoid embarrassment and stigma of "freshness." The authority for proposing and enforcing these customs is left in the hands of the Student Council. We include below a few suggestions and several articles of information, trusting that they may prove helpful to new men, since now, that there is no hazing the upper classmen must maintain their dignity by Freshmen obedience to custom.

Do not talk too much.

Do not carry a cane.

Do not sit on the college fence.

Do not fail to wear a pea-green Eton cap with its black button.

Do not smoke on the street.

Do not use all your cuts; you will want them later.

Do not acquire the "Hamp" habit too soon. Time enough for that during the last three years.

Do not go to Sophomore gym. The Sophomores will even be more interested in seeing you than you are in seeing the drill.

Do not try to impress any fraternity with your preeminent worth. They will discover it if it is present.

Do not ask when the fraternity initiations come, for you will not find out. Maintain a respectful silence on all matters connected with fraternities.

Do not enter the Draper Rathskellar or Rahar's Inn in Northampton before Feb. 22 except in the company of an upperclassman.

Never be afraid of overworking, for it is the Freshman year that counts in making your reputation as a student.

Do not be a nonentity. Take part in some college activity.

Do not be one-sided. You are at college to get an all-around education.

If in want of work, go to the Association bureau.

Watch the bulletin boards for information in regard to text-books, classes, etc.

Attendance at chapel and church services is required. Chapel every weekday at 8.15 a. m. Bell rings at 7.15 and 8; tolls at 8.08; quick stroke, 8.11; tolls at intervals of 8 sec. till 8.13½; double stroke till 8.14½; tolls at intervals of 8 sec. till 8.15, and then three strokes.

After morning prayers rise while the

faculty and three upper classes are passing out.

Freshmen seats are in the gallery.

Church service Sunday morning at 10-45. Freshmen occupy the south transept.

The revised rules as adopted by the Student body are as follows:

a. Freshmen shall be required to wear the regulation pea-green Eton cap with a black button not less than one and one-half (1½) inches in diameter, from the day college opens until the 22d of February.

b. Freshmen must wear the regulation caps within the town limits at all times except Sundays until the 22d of February.

c. No Freshman shall at any time occupy a seat in a trolley car when by so doing an upperclassman (Junior or Senior) is forced to stand.

d. All Freshmen shall enter and leave the chapel building at all times by its side door until after Senior chapel.

e. After morning chapel, all Freshmen must rise from their seats, and remain standing until the faculty and

three upper classes have passed out of Johnson Chapel.

f. No Freshman shall enter the Draper Rathskellar or Rahar's Inn in Northampton before February 22d except in the company of an upper classman.

g. Freshmen must not smoke on the street before the 22d of February.

h. All Freshmen are forbidden to wear preparatory school insignia.

i. Freshmen and Sophomores shall not be allowed to wear opera hats, silk hats, or carry canes, excepting that opera hats may be worn by anyone on a Musical Clubs trip.

1.—The Flag Rush

a. The rush shall be held the first Saturday evening of the Fall term at 7:30.

b. The contest shall not exceed ten minutes.

c. The flag, on a short view staff, is to be inserted in a socket 3 inches deep in such a manner that it may be easily removed, the socket being at the top of a heavy pole 8 feet 6 inches high.
