UC Irvine undergraduate students should consult with their UC Irvine Faculty Mentor to determine if Institutional Review Board (IRB) or Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) approval is needed. Institutional Review Board (IRB): Research involving Human Subjects

Is my research project "Exempt" from IRB approval?

"Exempt" research involves **less than minimal risk to human subjects**. With some exceptions, UC Irvine Faculty Mentors, working together with their student researchers, may **self-determine** whether their research qualifies as "Exempt."

How can I determine if my research qualifies for "Exempt Self-Determination?"

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What should I keep in mind as I apply for UROP's recognition and funding opportunity and determine IRB approval for my research project?

You will be following <u>two</u> parallel processes involving **both** the Undergraduate Research Opportunities Program (UROP) and the UCI Office of Research. Consider the following:

Steps You Need to Take for UROP

Verify in your online application the **status of your IRB process** by the deadline of the UROP recognition and funding opportunity you are applying to (e.g., REF, IRT, or SURP).

The status of your IRB process can include information such as whether your project qualifies as "Exempt" or is undergoing IRB review.

Steps You Need to Take for UCI Office of Research

Review the **Do You Need IRB Review?** information with your UC Irvine Faculty Mentor. Your faculty mentor will determine if the project qualifies as "Exempt."

If the project IS "Exempt:"

Complete and submit the "Administrative Determination-Exempt Self-Determination" form and supplementary documents in Kuali Research Protocols (KRP).

IRB approval is <u>NOT</u> needed, but IRB registration is still necessary <u>before you begin</u> your research.

If the project DOES NOT qualify as "Exempt:"

It must be added to an existing protocol or undergo an IRB review process and must be approved.

IRB approval <u>IS</u> needed <u>before you begin your</u> <u>research</u>. Follow the instructions on the IRB website, as needed.

Note from UROP: IRB registration or approval is not required by the time you submit your application for the UROP recognition and funding opportunity you're applying to (e.g., REF, IRT, or SURP). However, registration or approval is needed **before you begin your research**.

My research qualifies for "Exempt Self-Determination" (i.e., IRB review not required), what do I do next?

Self-determination is made by completing the "Administrative Determination-Exempt Self-Determination" form in **Kuali Research Protocols (KRP)**. **Do not submit this form to UROP.**

Complete this form with your UC Irvine Faculty Mentor's guidance to ensure all information is accurate. Follow the steps below:

- 1) Refer to the <u>Kuali Research Protocols (KRP) User Guide</u> for detailed instructions and screenshots for guidance on how to use KRP.
 - a. Please use Google Chrome or Firefox web browsers for optimal performance.
- 2) Log in to the Kuali Research Protocols (KRP) website using your UCInetID & password.
- 3) Select "New Protocol → IRB"

 - a. Answer the questions on the form and verify if the research qualifies as <u>"Exempt"</u> <u>Categories Eligible for Self-Determination</u>. If yes, mark which category it falls under.
 - 6) Exemption Status
 - a. If you meet the exemption requirements, a Green text confirmation statement will appear on your form in the "Self-Determination Eligibility" section (see image below). This is confirmation that you are "Exempt" from the IRB review and approval requirement.

- b. If your UC Irvine Faculty Mentor determines the project does NOT qualify as "Exempt" and requires IRB review and approval, you may wish to consider if it is possible to change the project design such that it would qualify for "Exempt" selfdetermination.
- 7) **Submit** the "Administrative Determination-Exempt Self-Determination" on the KRP website.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Compile all supplementary documents (e.g., survey questions, fliers used to advertise your study, etc.) and save them in a separate file for documentation purposes.
 - **<u>DO NOT</u>** attach or upload them into the KRP website.
- ✓ Save a copy of your completed protocol.
- ✓ A confirmation email of registration from KRP will **NOT** be sent.
 - Your study status will remain as "submitted" or "resubmitted" on the KRP website and will not change.
- IRB review and approval is not required for "Exempt" projects, and you will NOT receive any kind of "approval" documentation.
 - You may begin your research as soon as the form is submitted in Kuali Research Protocols (KRP).

Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC): Research involving Animal Subjects

Is my research project "Exempt" from IACUC approval?

If your research involves animal subjects, you must receive <u>IACUC approval</u> <mark>before you begin your</mark> <mark>research</mark>. <u>There are no exceptions.</u>

How can I determine if my research requires IACUC review and approval?

IACUC approval is not required by the time you submit your UROP recognition and funding opportunity you're applying to (e.g., REF, IRT, or SURP). However, *approval is needed before you* begin your research.
