What Is The UC Irvine Undergraduate Research Symposium?

The Undergraduate Research Symposium is an annual event that showcases the tremendous variety and depth of the undergraduate research culture at UC Irvine. Scheduled for May 12-16, 2025, this weeklong celebration welcomes all undergraduate students from across campus who have participated in a UCI-faculty-mentored research project or creative activity within the last year to share their research.

Four evenings of oral presentations lead up to the Poster and Performance Showcase, a day featuring poster presentations and inspired performances from the UC Irvine Claire Trevor School of the Arts. Below is an overview of Symposium week:

What is an Oral Presentation?

An oral presentation is a structured, 7-minute talk in which our presenters present their research project to a live audience. It is typically supported by visual aids, such as slides, and takes place in a competitive setting.

Oral presentations for the Symposium are scheduled from May 12–15, taking place from 5:00 to 7:00 PM in the UC Irvine Student Center. The Symposium is organized thematically, with each day focusing on a different aspect of research: Insights, Impacts, Innovations, and Inspirations. Tuesday's session is specifically dedicated to group presentations, while the other days feature individual presentations.

- **Monday, May 12: Insights**—A deep understanding or new way to think about or interact with a person, place, or thing.
- **Tuesday, May 13: Impacts**—A project that has affected the world, the community, and/or the researchers themselves. This session is for group presentations only (Group Presentations Only).
- Wednesday, May 14: Innovations—A new idea, method, or product.
- Thursday, May 15: Inspirations—An idea that causes people to want to take action.

All students selected for in-person oral presentations will receive a Chancellor's Award. One winner per presentation evening will additionally receive a \$100 gift card and medal.



Please note: Most of the content, including student presenter profiles, will be added to the program approximately one week before the Symposium. This ensures that you have the most current information about the presentations.




Key Features:
