

The Museum attracts many international visitors

Over half of non-exhibition visits are from first-time international visitors.




Many international visitors have turned to guided tours to experience the Museum

Tours give visitors the chance to experience the Museum in their native language.



Despite the prevalence of international tour groups (ITGs), the Museum has limited information about them



The Museum has published guidelines for large groups



"Groups must enter through the Montague Place Entrance"

> "Tour groups are not permitted in rooms 61, 62, and 63"





"It is suggested groups of more than 30 are divided into separate groups"

Our goal was to identify strategies to help the British Museum manage ITGs and improve visitor experience.



We had three objectives for our research:



- Characterise the behaviour of international tour groups

16 observations were used to establish the typical ITG.

16 observations were used to establish the typical ITG.

Timing and tracking data: where do ITGs go and for how long?

Double-entry notes: are ITG participants engaged, do ITGs follow guidelines?




Double-entry notes: do ITGs slow or divert traffic? Do they block sightlines? Do they crowd any facilities?



The three groups that visited the Chinese Ceramics exhibit spoke Chinese



























































































Layout changes could improve flow




Visitors are impacted most in the Assyrian Galleries







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ITGs had the most friction with other private tours

Interviewed guides reported that it was difficult to share space with large tours.

Noise was a consistent problem for guides.



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Interviewed guides reported that it was difficult to share space with large tours.

Noise was a consistent problem for guides.

"I would skip objects if there are other groups around them or other guides taking a long time in front of it."

"...there were lots of schools at the same time, so I had to scream a little bit."

Changes to the tour guidelines could lessen impact of ITGs

Encourage use of amplification systems





Recommend shortening stops to 5 minutes



Restrict guiding in rooms 7 and 10

Further research is necessary to better contextualize the behaviour of ITGs
