






## An impact reporting system is essential for amenity groups, like HB&P








1) General overview of HB&P's consultation across England and Wales




HB&P balances their CoU consultations geographically






A majority of HB&P's English Cases were proposals for buildings to become domestic.






A plurality of HB&P's Welsh Casework was conversions of religious buildings.
