La Goyco's History

The Pedro G. Goyco School was a publicly funded elementary school located in Santurce, Puerto Rico. Due to lack of enrollment and the underperformance of students, the Goyco School was closed permanently in 2015. During the period of Hurricane Maria, the Pedro G Goyco school was used as a safe haven for residents to receive necessities and take refuge. Beyond the school closure, there was no organized process to enroll the students at a different school or repurpose the school building.

After the Machuchal community's unsuccessful attempt to keep the school open, they began grassroot efforts to repurpose the school building for the community, as the school helped preserve their communities' resilience. After five years of grassroot efforts to organize community support through social movements and gatherings, they were able to obtain ownership of the building in 2020.



Fundamental Pillars: Culture, Environment and Health

"We are a community entity that works with three fundamental aspects as pillars: **Culture**, **Health** and **Environment**. These are areas where the quality of life of the people who live in this sector can be definitively improved,"

Fundamental Pillars: Culture, Environment and Health

The programs and services offered at Goyco can be divided into three pillars: **Culture**, **Health** and **Environment**. It is important to note that the Machuchal sector in Santurce, Puerto Rico is made up of a predominantly elderly population. Many of the community's needs are linked to this population, therefore La Goyco places strong emphasis on health resources at the center.


In addition, the Machuchal sector is home to a very diverse population of artists, musicians, actors, and more. Because of this, Machuchal has always been a pillar for rich cultures that defines the community. Beyond the physical threats of hurricanes that face these populations, financial actors such as gentrification also pose a threat to the community. With rapid gentrification of the area, its growing presence threatens the preservation of culture within the Santurce community. This results in the need for continuous community promotion and empowerment of the culture that is still there. La Goyco's cultural pillar aims to preserve Santurce's existing cultural identity.

Lastly, the Machuchal community attracts many tourists. For this reason, the streets tend to have lots of trash. La Goyco's environmental pillar aims to keep the Machuchal area clean.

Culture



Music







Health


Health is an important part of keeping any community safe. For a community that contains mostly elderly people, it is very important to make sure these people stay healthy and get the services they need. In recognition of this, La Goyco offers health services to the community. During the pandemic these services include handing out test kits and being a place to get the COVID vaccine. They also offer psychoanalysis clinics once a week.

Caring for Our Community



The Machuchal community contains a mostly elderly population which is why La Goyco prioritizes health as part of its mission. La Goyco holds health fairs and other events each month to provide health services to the community. These services are geared to the elderly population of the community but can be accessed by anyone.

Distribution of Health Services



La Goyco holds a community fair each month that provides the majority of the health services for the community each month. La Goyco also hosts other health related events throughout the month. These events have included COVID vaccines and tests. These events are run by La Goyco volunteers and retired nurses that reside in Santurce.

Environment


The environment in which a community resides affects how the community can grow. La Goyco has a passion for growing the Machuchal neighborhood and keeping it strong. This in mind, La Goyco chooses to educate the Machuchal neighborhood on the environment and how to care for it. The community center holds many environmental education workshops and also houses microbusinesses that recycle waste into art.

Educational System



La Goyco hosts environmental workshops for both young and old residents of the Machuchal community. These workshops include explanations of basic waste and recycling management that is easy for everyone to understand. Residents of the community are also encouraged to help with the garden walkway seen in the back of the property. The walkway includes native flowers and shrubs as well as some of the repurposed glass that La Goyco has collected. La Goyco is able to use the walkway to educate those in the community about what they can do for their own gardens and the environment.

Glass Art Workshops




La Goyco's glass art workshops show the attendees how to recycle the collected glass into art such as wind chimes.

Environmental Partnerships: Estuario

ESTUARIO is an outside company that La Goyco has been working with on waterway conservation. Through this relationship, La Goyco has been the contact point between the organization and the Machuchal community. The organization aims to protect the local waters through education and cleaning the trash from the streets. ESTUARIO is also the organization that helped La Goyco obtain their solar panels and water cistern systems.
