If you could sail anywhere, where would you go?



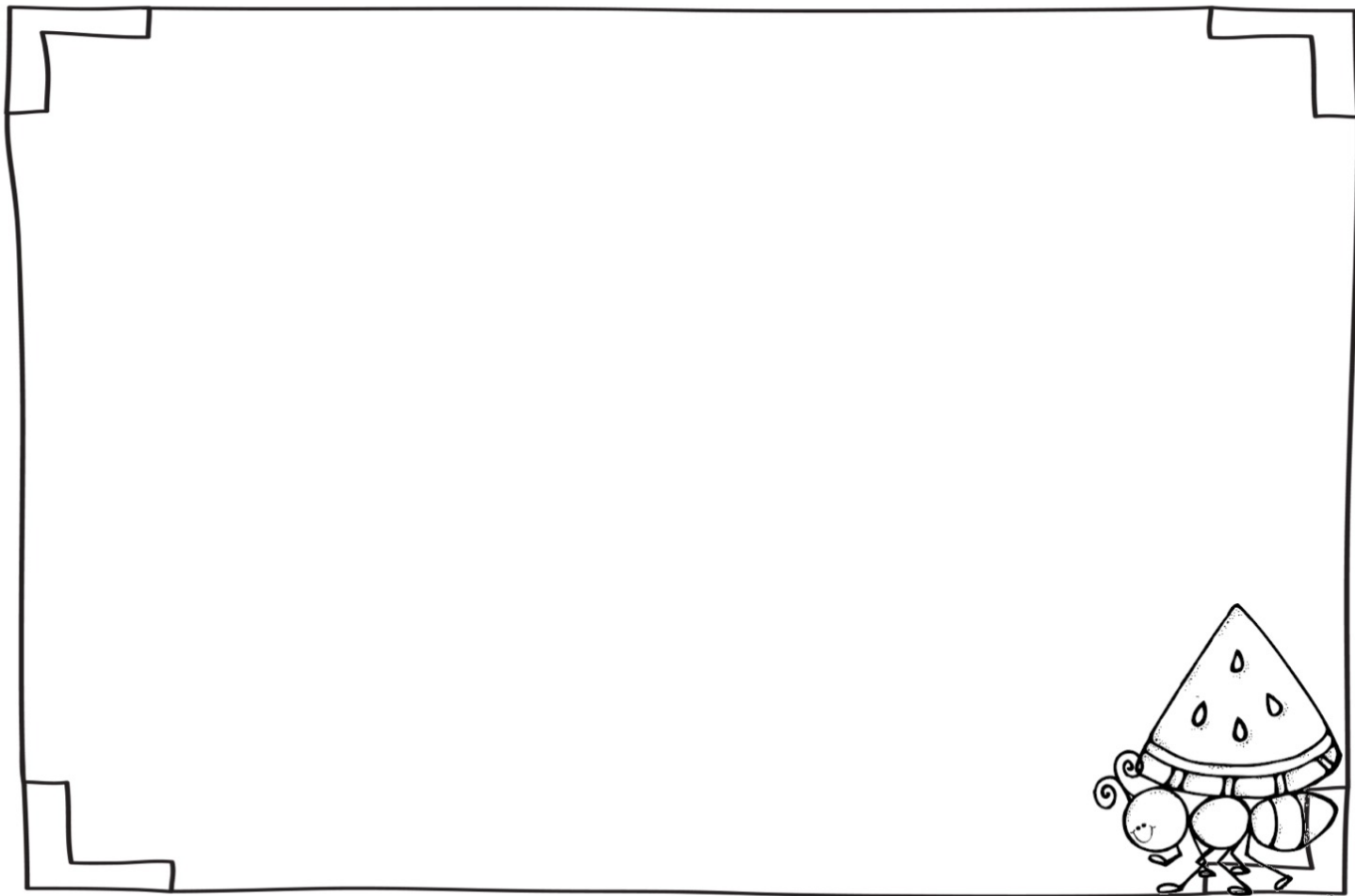

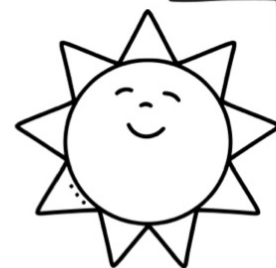

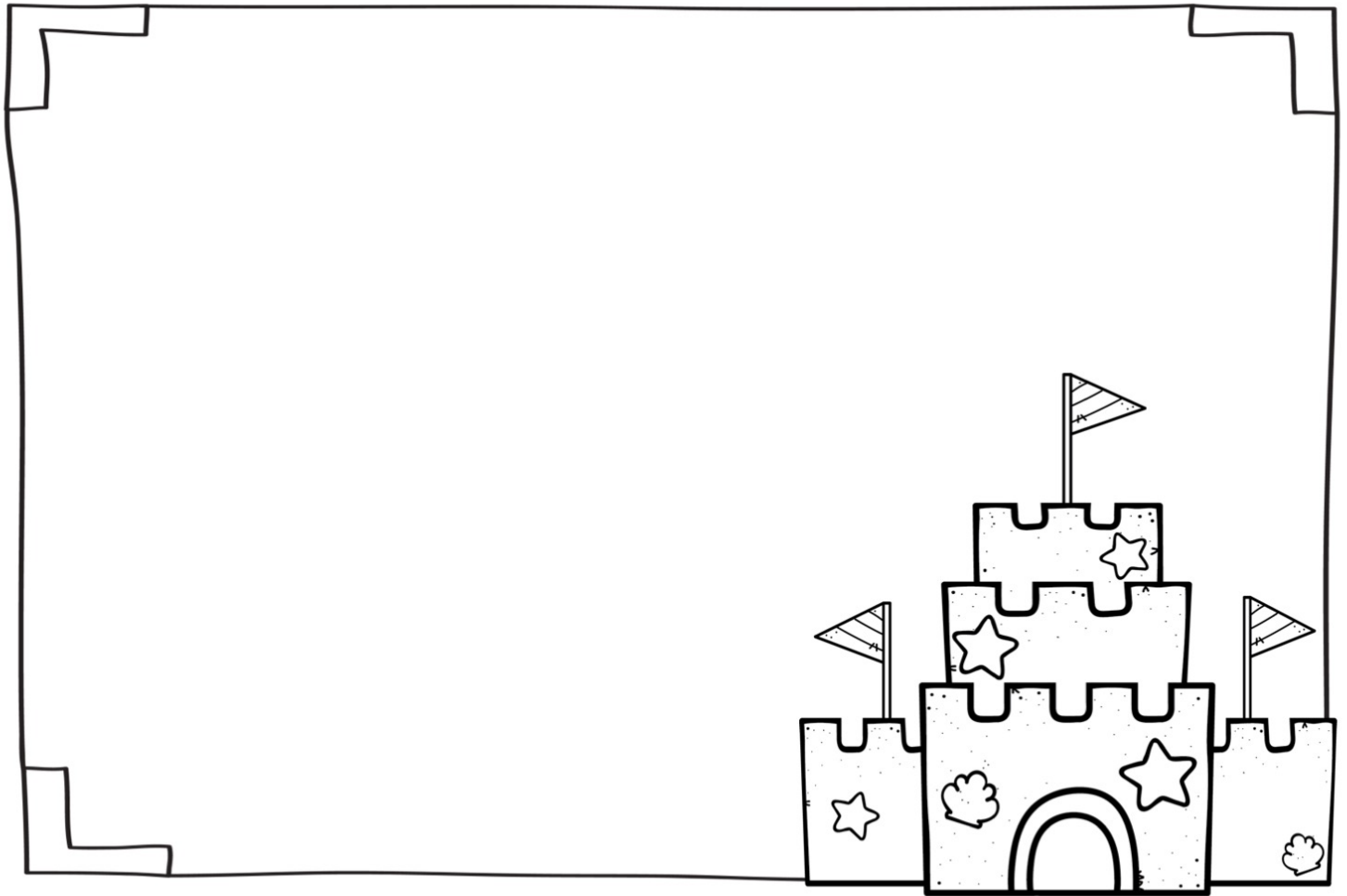

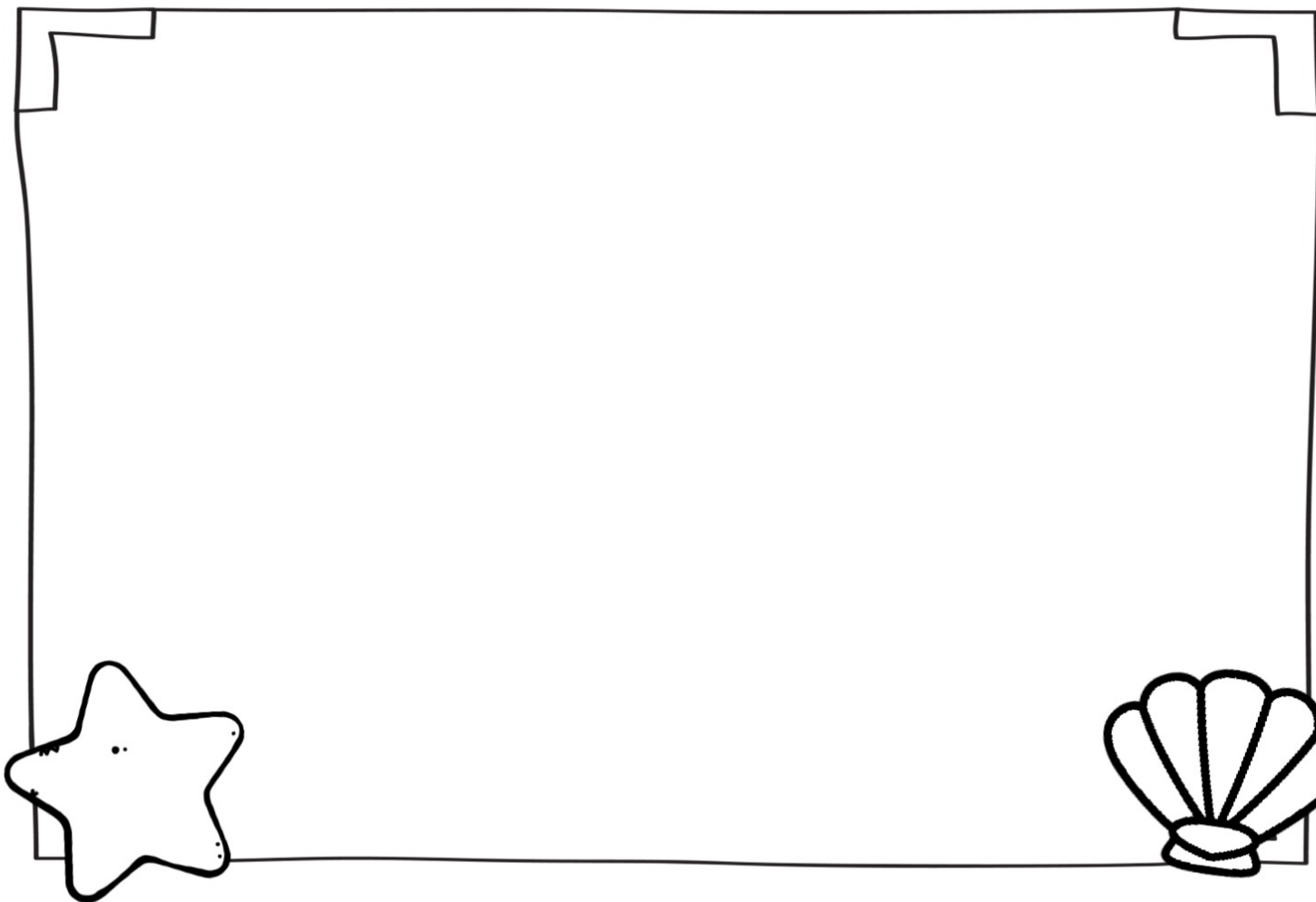
